Roger Bailey has the Feature Car of the Month

This month's feature car is the 1932 Ford roadster owned by new club member Roger Bailey. Although it looks like a fresh build (the odometer shows only 5,000 miles), it was actually built 25 years ago by Sunrise Color here in Grants Pass. The car has a very traditional look from its large commercial headlights to its '39 Ford teardrop tail lights. This full fendered beauty is painted Brilliant Red with subtle orange graphics, and sports a black leather interior. And the underside of the car is just as nice as the top—everything is either painted red, polished or chromed. It's powered by a 350 Chevy with aluminum heads and an Edelbrock carb, has a Turbo 350 transmission, and a Ford 9" rear. The front suspension is a chromed I-beam with a monoleaf spring and radius rods, and rear suspension is a 4-bar (also chromed) with coilover shocks. Front disc and rear drum brakes stop it with the help of a dual master cylinder and power booster. Wheels are black steelies with beauty rings and early Ford hubcaps, and the black convertible top complements the same colored wheels and interior. Roger says the car drives and stops great! Unfortunately, health issues are forcing him to sell the car, asking price is \$60K. If interested contact Roger at 541-295-5909.
