30TH ANNUAL FABULOUS 50'S BIGGER, BETTER, STRONGER

There are few regional shows that stand the test of time. Unlike those shows whose time has come and gone, the Fabulous 50's Charity Car Show held here in Grants Pass is one of the exceptions to the rule as it celebrated its 30th Anniversary this year. One of the reasons for its long staying power is the fact that you, as members of the Rogue Valley Classic Cruisers put on a show this year that embraced change by taking time to listen to both the exhibitors and attendees and implementing many of the suggestions they make.

The Fabulous 50's three-day weekend started with the Free Kickoff Show and Shine on Friday morning and afternoon where collector cars and trucks filled the Growers Market lot in downtown Grants Pass. Adding interest to the event is the free Merchant Walk through town where participants had a chance to win prizes. Later in the day from 5:00PM to 9:00PM the free Fabulous 50's American Graffiti Cruise In at Jimmy's Classic Drive-In was an overwhelming success with lots of cool cars and trucks not only in the parking lot but spilling out into the street and adjacent lots. This show provides the perfect opportunity to return to a simpler time not so long ago when enthusiasts of all ages strutted their stuff in their hot rods, muscle cars and customs, showing off their pride and joy for the world to see.

On Saturday, it was time for "The Really Big Show" as Ed Sullivan would have called it. Held at the Josephine County Fairgrounds, like everything else about the weekend, it was bigger and better than ever. For the first time in the 30-year history of the show, there was an indoor display called "The Special Collection" with 31 show vehicles of all kinds in a cool building. Add to that, a 20-vehicle display in the Patio under roof, along with numerous vehicles on the grass under the trees, including a large display of classic Model A Fords, courtesy of the Henry's Lady car club. There were also Corvettes from the Southern Oregon Corvette Association and a gaggle of sports cars, complements of the British Car Club. In addition, another first this year as part of the show, there was a Swap Meet and For Sale Car Corral. Add to that a large display of vehicles on the Show Field and The Midway including the Past Champions Exhibit.

As if there couldn't be more, on Sunday, the hits just kept on coming, with the free Fabulous 50's Hot Rod and Handlebars Show at the Corvette Bar and Grill in Grants Pass from 12:00PM to 4:00PM. The Fabulous 50's has grown into three full days of fun in the sun, and we're already looking forward to the 2026 Fabulous 50's.

Feature Car of the Month

Chris & Pauline Lehuede's 1968 Dodge Charger R/T

This month's feature car, the Lehuede's Charger R/T, is a beautifully restored muscle car. But it's the story that is the most interesting part of this car. This is Chris' first car, so he's had it for over 40 years. Except for that year when it was stolen.

When Chris was 14 he saw the movie Dirty Mary, Crazy Larry. That's when he decided his first car had to be a Dodge Charger. Every day on the way to school he passed a car under a tarp, and the more he looked at it, the more the shape looked like a Dodge Charger. When he finally saw the owner outside, he asked if it was a Charger. Yes, it was. And is it for sale? Yes, it was. Even though the car was only about 10 years old, it didn't run. Chris gave the man \$450, all the money he'd saved, and he and his dad pushed it home.

Chris knew he needed a job to fix up his car, so he lied about his age and got a job at the mall. By the time he was 16 and got his driver's license, the car was drivable. He built a radical engine (that sounded like a funny car) and drove it like his heroes on the TV show The Dukes of Hazzard. He collected 6 tickets in his first six months of driving, and received a letter from the DMV stating his license would be suspended after the next ticket. He reluctantly parked his dream car and bought a 4-door Chevy Nova—a 'grandma' car. His strategy worked--he didn't get pulled over once in the Nova.

Chris wanted to get the Charger painted. After checking around, he took it to a body shop that worked on Ferrari's and other high end cars. He left a deposit and the shop started work, getting the car in primer. Chris periodically stopped by the shop to monitor progress. Then one day he went to the shop and it was closed, empty, and all of the cars were gone, including his Charger. He filed a police report, then heard nothing.

About a year later Chris was driving to work, taking the same route he took every day. He spotted a Charger on the opposite side of the street and turned around to check it out. When he saw the sticker in the back window he knew it was his missing car! He quickly found a pay phone (pre- cell phone times) and called the police—and hoped the car would still be there when he got back. It was—and the police arrived. They verified it was Chris's car and searched the neighborhood in vain for the driver. Chris got to take his Charger back home!

About 6 months later the District Attorney called. They'd caught the body shop owner and needed Chris to identify him in court. The thief had to work in prison and make restitution to Chris—he received 2 or 3 checks for about \$130.

In about 1995, Chris decided it was time to restore the car. He did an exceedingly correct restoration using all matching numbers parts with correct date codes. He made a couple of very lucky finds while searching for correct parts. He found a new air cleaner at a dealer, and the correct carburetor at Pep Boys! But all did not go smoothly. When the mechanical portion of the resto was done, Chris took it for a test drive. Things were going fine until the rear end locked up after only a few miles of driving sending the Charger skidding across the road and almost flipping. Investigation showed that the mechanic that rebuilt the rear end forgot to put in oil. The rear end was completely ruined—even the housing was unusable and had to be replaced.

After the mechanicals were complete, the car was painted and upholstered. When a small hole that was discovered was being welded up, the car caught fire. The carpet, dashboard, wiring and windshield were all severely damaged. After this, Chris couldn't bear to look at the car and sent it to friend to be repaired.

Now, the car is as good, or better, than new. The Charger is an original, numbers matching 440 4-barrel car with an automatic transmission. Its options include air conditioning, tinted windows, and turn signals in the hood. Front disc brakes were added for drivability, the only deviation from stock. This car was the beginning of Chris & Pauline's Mopar obsession.
